I am writing to advise you regarding the information you requested on 25 February .

I must advise you that following a search of our paper and electronic records, I have been unable to compile a definitive list of all the schemes carried out on the A1237. The relevant files have either been destroyed in compliance with our Disposal Records or simply cannot be located.

However, I have been able to find information about some of the schemes completed and this is contained in the attached document. As I indicated in the voicemail message I left earlier today, I hope to have further information in the next week or fortnight, which I will forward to you.

In keeping with the spirit and effect of the Freedom of Information Act, all information is assumed to be releasable to the public unless exempt. We will, therefore, be simultaneously releasing to the public the information you requested, together with any related information that will provide a key to its wider context via our website: <http://www.highways.gov.uk/>

If you are unhappy with the way we have handled your request, you may ask for an internal review. The process is detailed in the attached document. You should contact me if you wish to complain.
