

# A6 A5111 Raynesway Park Junction Improvements

Residents Newsletter Issue July 2010

## Background

The work to construct the new A6 and A5111 Raynesway park junction is proceeding well. Those of you passing through will have noticed the construction of the junction and new bridge to the commercial park taking shape. In July there will be further changes to the road layout to allow the final completion of the new junction.

## Current Works

We have made good progress over the last few weeks with work well under way to complete the bridge connecting to the new commercial park. As part of the current phase of work those travelling south have been diverted under the partially completed bridge, while those travelling north have continued to use the new slip road on the A5111 to the west of the original road. Towards the end July traffic travelling south to the A6,

Alvaston and the commercial park will be diverted onto the new sliproads and roundabout. Traffic for Alvaston will use the new bridge. Those travelling north will continue to the west of the original road to go to Alvaston or Derby, but access to the commercial park and A6 south (for the M1 (South) and A50) will be via the bridge.

Access to Raynesway Park Drive (for the waste recycling centre) will be from the road that links the two roundabouts.

## What happens next

While we are completing the final road layout we will also:

- Reconstruct the A6 north and southbound carriageways which will run under the new bridge,
- Complete the verges, pedestrian footpaths and cycle routes

- Complete the landscaping of the junction, including planting shrubs and trees,
- Complete the southern roundabout at Raynesway including the permanent traffic signals.

## How long will it take

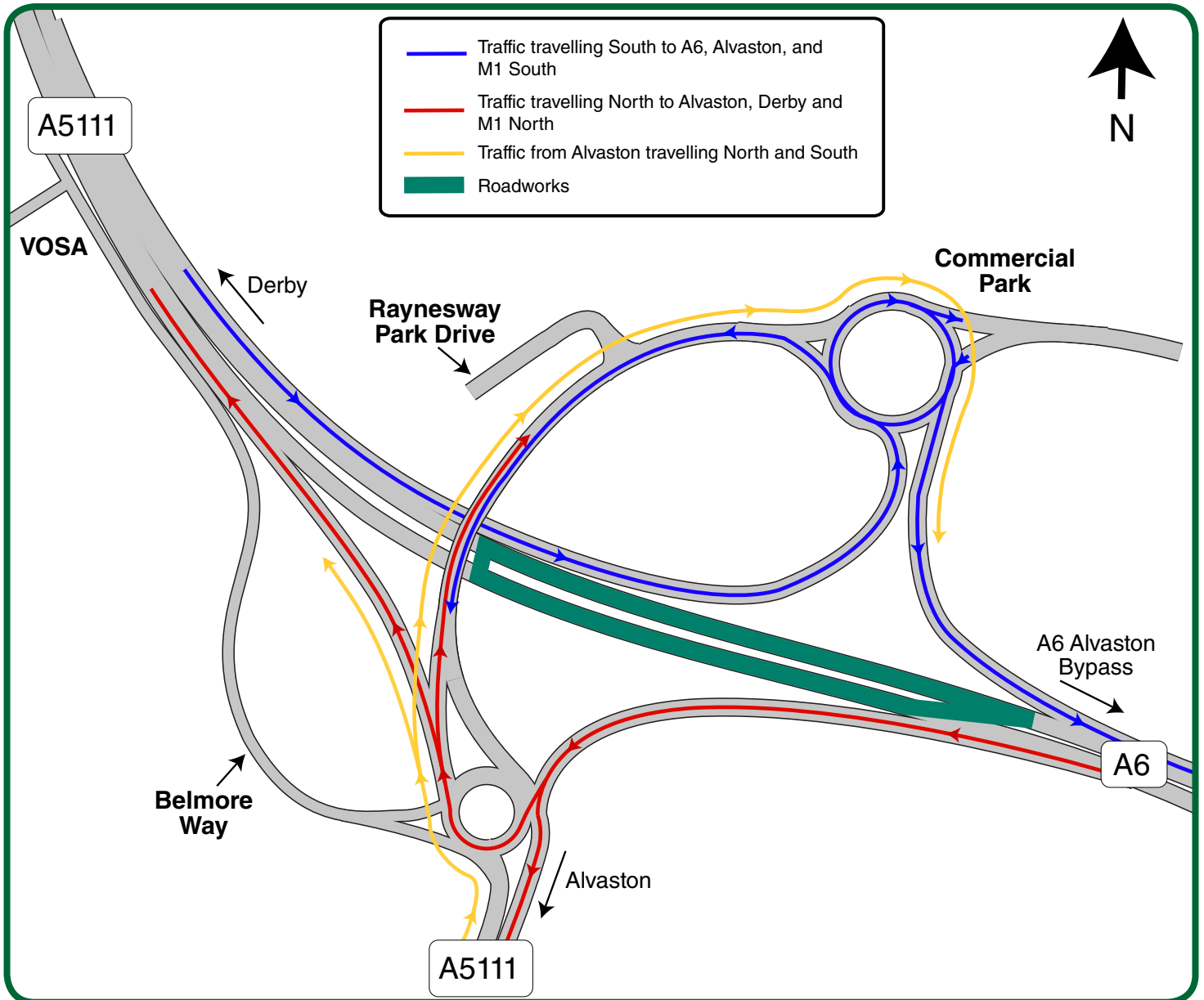
This period of work will take about 2 months to complete then the junction will officially be opened this autumn.

## Pedestrians and Cyclists

While we are completing the works there will still be some temporary pedestrian paths, cycle routes and crossings until the final paths and cycletracks are finished.

## Safety at roadworks



The Highways Agency is working with the industry and road users to reduce the risks of working on the roads.

For the safety of roadworkers and all road users, when you are approaching roadworks:

- Keep within the speed limit – it is there for your safety.
- Get into the correct lane in good time – don't keep switching.
- Concentrate on the road ahead, not the roadworks.
- Be alert for works' traffic leaving or entering roadworks.
- Keep a safe distance – there could be queues in front.
- Observe all signs – they are there to help you.
