HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

**THE M1 LONDON TO YORKSHIRE MOTORWAY (WIDENING JUNCTIONS 6A TO
10 (NICHOLLS FARM DRIVE) SIDE ROADS)
(SUPPLEMENTARY) ORDER 200**

THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR TRANSPORT hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under sections 18 and 125 of the Highways Act 1980, in relation to the part of the M1 London to Yorkshire Motorway situated in the County of Hertfordshire, which will:

- (1) authorise him to –
 - (a) stop up a highway,
 - (b) construct a new highway,

all on or in the vicinity of the route of the part of the Motorway mentioned above; and

- (2) provide for the transfer of the new highway to Hertfordshire County Council as highway authority as from the date on which he notifies them that it has been completed and is open for traffic.

COPIES of each draft Order and the plan referred to in it may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours from 23rd July 2009 until 10th September 2009 or within 7 weeks from the date of first publication of this notice if that period expires later, at the Highways Agency, Major Projects National, C8, Broadway, Broad Street, Birmingham, B15 1BL; and at Highways Agency, Woodlands, Manton Lane, Manton Industrial Estate, Bedford, MK41 7LW; and at Hertfordshire County Council, County Hall, Pegs Lane, Hertfordshire, SG13 8DQ, Hertfordshire County Council, Highways Department, 2nd Floor, Trident House, 42 – 48 Victoria Street, St Albans, Hertfordshire, AL1 3HZ.

ANY PERSON MAY OBJECT to the making of any of the Order not later than 10th September 2009, or within 7 weeks from the date of first publication of this notice if that period expires later, by notice to the Secretary of State at the offices of the Highways Agency, Major Projects National, C8, Broadway, Broad Street, Birmingham B15 1BL, quoting reference HA/065/021/000176 and stating the grounds of objection. In the preparation of an objection and the statement of grounds of objection it should be borne in mind that the substance of any objection or representation may be communicated to other people who may be affected by it.
